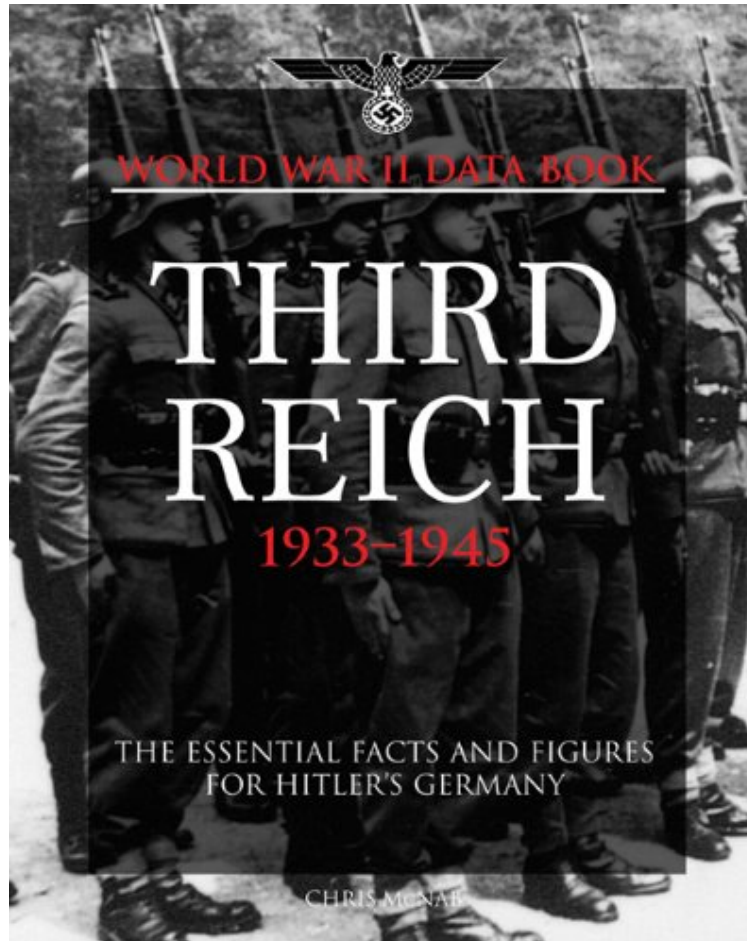

Miller This book is like someone taking the whole 21 volumes of the Time-Life Series: "The Third Reich" and putting the highlights together in one book for a World War II general reference guide. It has some similarities to author Louis L. Snyder's, "Encyclopedia of the Third Reich". However, where that book is a A-Z dictionary with an emphasis on people and personalities, this book focuses much more on a chronological presentation of the history, structure, politics, social studies, manpower, production, and economics in relation to Germany under the government (and control) of the Nazi Party (1933-1945). The book has many easy-to-follow charts, graphs and maps to digest; making it a good quick reference guide. The volume does have some overlap with "World War II Data Book: The SS". The detailed charts and maps are what I like best. For the general interested reader or student, it offers plenty of information. It covers: History of the Reich. Geography. The Nazi Economy.
