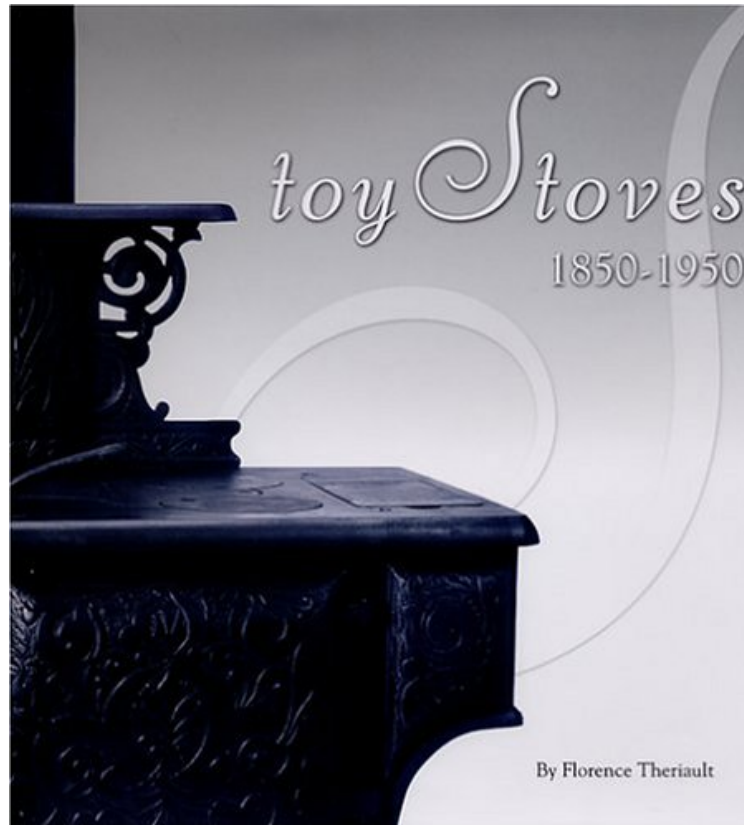

Turns out that the markings on the stove was the ID to who manufactured it. It turned out to be an odd Sterling stove. Instead of stating the word Sterling on the left hand shelf. It has a series of symbols that are on the stove itself. The pictures in this book showed me some of these symbols and then I noticed them on mine. I have only seen one other like it on E-bay and passed on the info to the seller.Do yourself a favor. Buy this book. Don't be fooled by sellers who call everything a "Salesman Sample". They are just out to take your money. Most of them are toys and the buyer needs to know that. Get the book and know what you are buying. Don't be deceived. Really. Salesman Samples are very rare out there.Also. Using this book you can identify rare toys stoves before buying them. Even when the seller thought it was a lamp. I have one stove ( made 1857)that was converted to a simple lamp. I paid \$25 plus \$11 shipping. It's worth around \$450 - 500. All because I remembered it being in this book.
