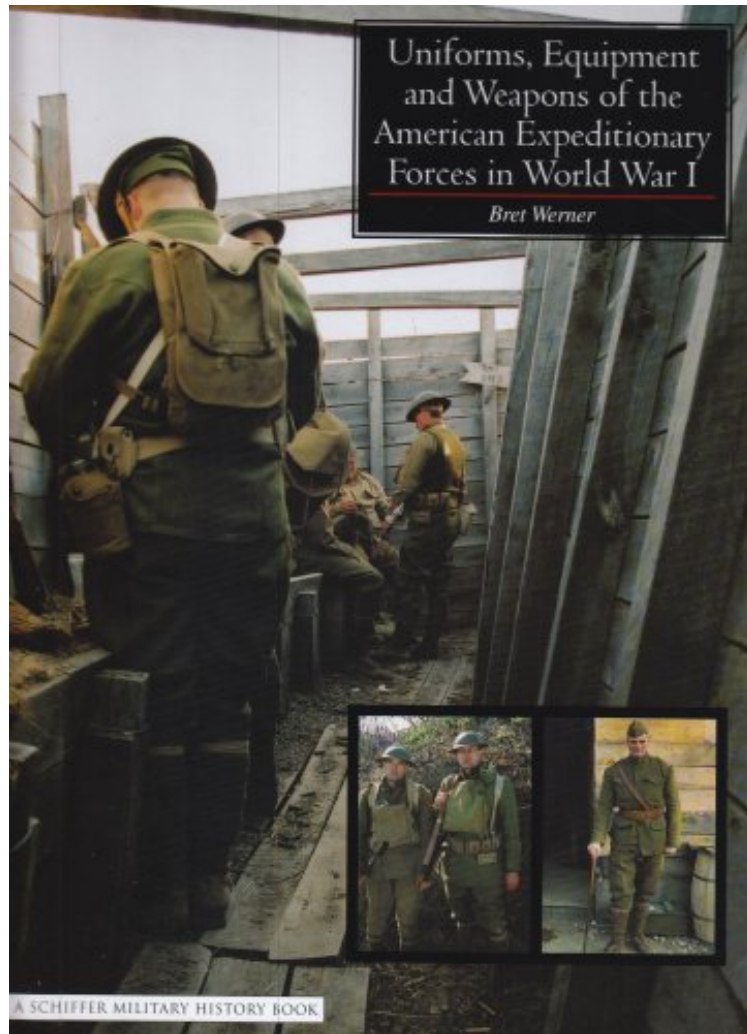

Super look into what the Doughboy of the Great War wore and used By BuglerJay Brett Werner has done a fantastic job of accumulating information on the uniform and gear that the American Doughboy took to Europe and used in the last two years of World War I. He had good contacts in the collector community who were able to provide actual examples of the vast array of "gear" that was needed for soldiers

in the field during the early 20th century, a time of massive change as nations had to cope with the beginning of industrialized war in the post-black powder era. Even mundane items like meat cans (mess kits), cartridge belts, the design of the Overseas Cap had an impact on the soldiers' lives as the material culture of the era adapted to new weapons, massive numbers of troops, and warfare that had become three dimensional as they fought not only on the ground, but under it as well as in the air. It's well organized and the comments are quite readable, rather than being a simple collection of photos with dull descriptions that one often finds in this kind of work. His use of original wartime photos along with staged pictures of "experimental archeologists" makes the presentation of the material more interesting.
