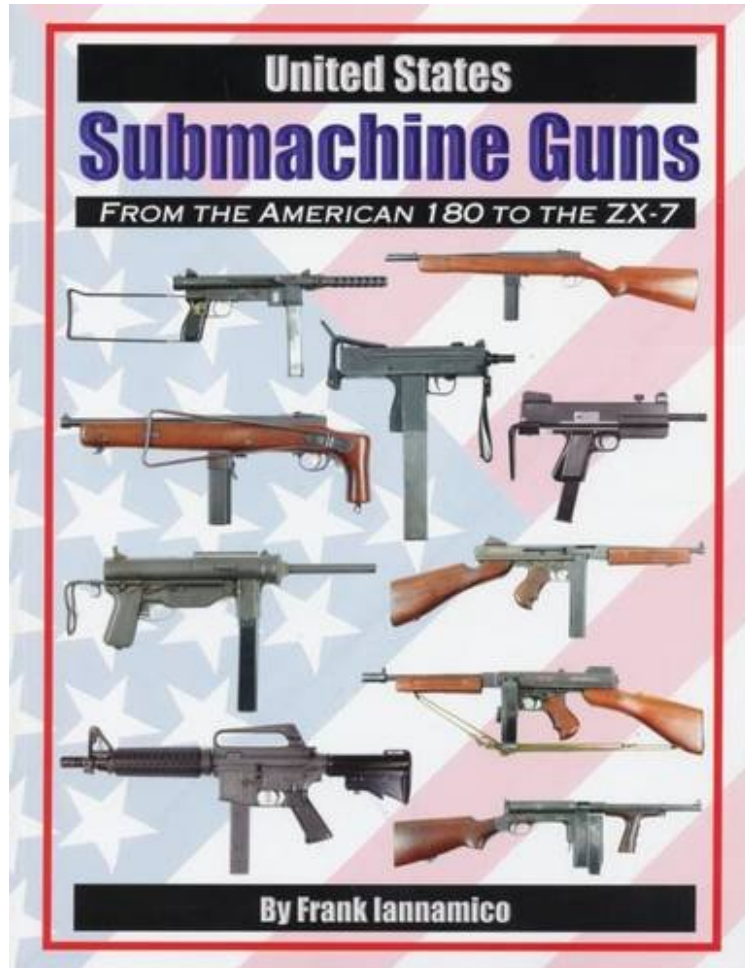

It has coverage of many that are not detailed in other books on the subject. It adds information on the Reising Submachine gun, for example, that did not appear in Iannamico's earlier book, which was specific to the Reising. It also has a really great section on West Hurley Thompson Submachine Guns. I reference this book frequently, and it is the current best resource on MAC firearms, the Ingram Model 6, the SW Model 76, and the UD-M42 SMG. This book is often overlooked as an excellent resource on the subject, and if
